


- •Keep emergency contact information current with front office staff.
- Report illnesses & injuries such as: Covid, Strep Throat, Flu, Chickenpox, Fractures, Head Lice etc. to the School Nurse.
- ALL medications to be administered at school must have a written Doctor's order. This includes all over-thecounter medications such as Tylenol (acetaminophen), Advil (ibuprofen), cough drops, allergy eye drops and topical ointments.

When to Stay Home

Please consider the following guidelines to help determine if your child should be sent to school, or remain at home.

- He/She has a temperature at or above 100.0° F. They should remain at home until fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication.
- He/She is coughing frequently or having any breathing difficulty.
- He/She has vomited two or more times. Should stay home for 24 hours after last symptom without the use of medication.
- He/She has diarrhea. Should stay home for 24 hours after last symptom without the use of medication.
- He/She has a rash. Should stay home until fever or rash is gone for 24 hours or until a doctor has seen the student and has given written permission to return to school.
- When in doubt, you can always call the Nurse's Office for clarification.

Back to School Information



- Keep all contact information up to date in PowerSchool and with the front office.
- It is the responsibility of every parent to provide a copy of their student's Immunization Record or Original Exemption to the Front Office / Nurse's Office Immunization documents can be brought to school during Pre K Roundup and one week before school starts.
- When the School Nurse calls you, please answer. Have a plan on how your student can be picked up if they become ill or are injured during school hours.
- For Pre K 2nd grade, please send a clean pair of pants, shirt, underwear and socks to keep either in their backpack or in their cubby/locker at school.
- Please share any pertinent health information with the Nurse. The Nurse needs to know if your child has a chronic health condition, is taking any medications, any diagnoses that may pertain to school, and any FOOD ALLERGIES.
- If your child has Food Allergies, Allergies that require an Epipen, or will need to take medication at school, please see the Nurse to get the appropriate paperwork for your Physician to complete.
