

My love for children and my journey as an educator has helped me understand the behavior and psychology of young minds and adapt my skills to their specific needs using a patient approach.


Ms. Mackenzie Solis- SEAS Teacher

go back to school and receive my Master's in Mental Health Counseling.



Laura Guadamuz-Kinder DLE Teacher


Hi, my name is Laura





Classroom Supplies and Updates- Your child has support from FWISD.

FWISD elementary school families,

You can check to buy school supplies off your summer to-do list!

The Fort Worth ISD will provide free supplies for every elementary school student enrolled for the 2023-2024 academic year.

FWISD Board of Education trustees approved the authorization of more than \$2.1 million in federal Elementary and Secondary School (ESSER) funds to support the school supply purchase at its May 23 meeting.

All supplies will be purchased prior to the first day of school and will be distributed to students during the first week of classes. Each school supply pack is grade specific. This is the third year FWISD is covering school supply costs for elementary school students. District officials say the purchase ensures every elementary student, regardless of income level, has immediate access to tools for instruction on the first day of school.

The 2023-2024 school year begins Monday, Aug. 14.

Dismissal and Pick Up-Safety First and Arrival News

Our school is currently incorporating geo-fencing and tracking technologies in order to migrate to a more secure pick-up process. This technology will ensure that all students are located and that their parents are identified by utilizing QR scanning codes. The geo-fence is now installed. We moved to a new and safer method with Pikmykid last year and are ready to start again this school year. On Meet the Teacher, all parents will receive their Pikmykid information as well as vehicle tags for a personalized and strictly regulated experience.

CAMPUS SECURITY AND SURROUNDING AREAS

All entrances to our campus are kept secured. Only employees with admission credentials are permitted inside specific zones. FWISD badges must be worn at all times by all employees. Every guest must buzz in to enter the front office. If asked, kindly be ready to present identification. To work with students, all volunteers must have clearance. All visitors to our campus will still be screened using the Raptor system.

Staff is not permitted to open doors for anyone who is not cleared by FWISD or an area officer. These individuals must follow all entry procedures.

Closed Fence Entry

Updated gates were added to our parking lot and entrances to the playground will be closed to all visitors. The parking lot is closed to visitors.

EARLY ARRIVAL-

Students who come before 7:40 am may enter the building with the assistance of the designated staff. Please make contact with the front office if your family has a unique requirement or circumstance that necessitates an early drop-off so that we can be ready. If students are dropped off before 7:30 am, they must buzz in upon arrival and will be moved to the cafeteria.

On-Time Arrival- Students must be seated and ready to begin academic warm-up exercises and breakfast by 7:50 a.m. We strongly advise your child to arrive before 7:50 a.m. to provide them enough time to eat and begin working on class tasks. Teachers arrive at 7:40 a.m.

You will need to provide staff with with your child's information in the pick-up line if you did not attend Meet the Teacher Night or if your child did not obtain their individualized car tag for pick-up.



FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL PROCEDURES

Please take note that all Parents may escort their child to class on the first day of school as we continue to support our students in developing leadership and independence. Check-ins

and dismissals will be observed by our campus security. There will only be one entrance available for drop-offs, which is our primary security door at Visit Station 1, which is situated in front of the campus. Since this is our pick-up and drop-off area, parents are not permitted to park their cars in front of the school. On the first day, you must park only on Wheeler St. or Parish St. if you intend to walk your child to class. Our neighborhood law enforcement will issue tickets to any vehicles stopped in the drop-off zone off Kings Highway or Gibbons St. This is for the sake of all children's safety. During the school year, there is no double parking on Kings Highway or Gibbons Dr.


On the second day, all students will independently walk to class with the help of administrative personnel and student ambassadors. We will help families on day two only in the most dire situations if modifications are required pending the student and/or scenario. Although it could appear difficult we must begin establishing procedures immediately.

Every month on the last Friday for lunch, all parents are invited to come to our campus.

Every last Friday of the month, parents are invited to come to our campus and have lunch with their kids.

Parents must present their ID when entering the building to pick up students for early dismissals, volunteer activities, or teacher conferences. This ID is then checked for clearance by our security system. Without clearance, visitors may not enter the classrooms or cafeteria.


